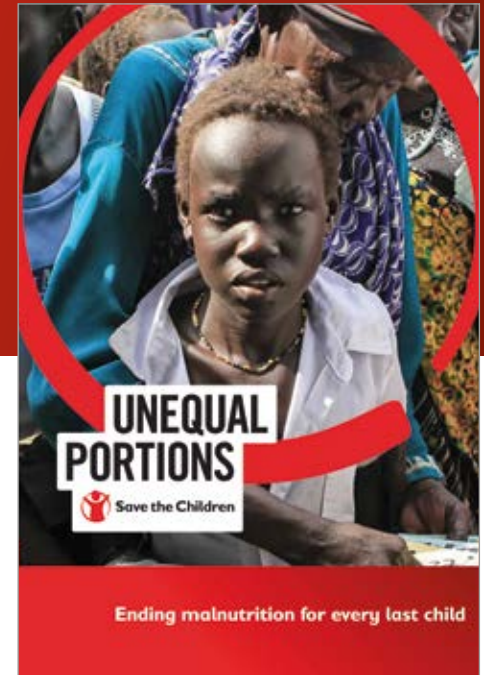

Unequal Portions: Ending malnutrition for every last child

Good nutrition – a healthy, balanced, adequate diet – is a matter of life or death, the difference between surviving or thriving. It is essential for a healthy immune system, to protect against disease throughout life. And it is crucial for a country's inclusive and sustainable development. But progress in tackling malnutrition is far too slow. Millions of children are missing out on adequate nutrition because of who they are and where they live. They are discriminated against because of their ethnicity or

disability; they are excluded because of their parents' lack of income or after being forced from their homes.

This report tells the story of these forgotten children. And it sets out what is required to ensure every last child gets the nutrition they need. If we are serious about creating a world where no child is malnourished, we must tackle the discrimination and exclusion they face.

Inclusive Education: What, Why, and How: A handbook for program implementers

Inclusive education is one dimension of a rights-based quality education, which emphasizes equity in access and participation, and responds positively to the individual learning needs and competencies of all children. Inclusive education is child-centered and places the responsibility of adaptation on the education system rather than the individual child. Save the Children supports inclusive education in all contexts as a thematic priority in Early Childhood Care and Development and Basic Edu-

cation. This handbook is part of the Inclusive Education Working Group's initiative to ensure that all Save the Children education programs are inclusive and supportive of all children. Although not all education projects have the word "inclusive" in the title or goals, every education project can and should be made more inclusive, and we encourage this resource to be used by all education staff, not only those working on targeted inclusive education projects.

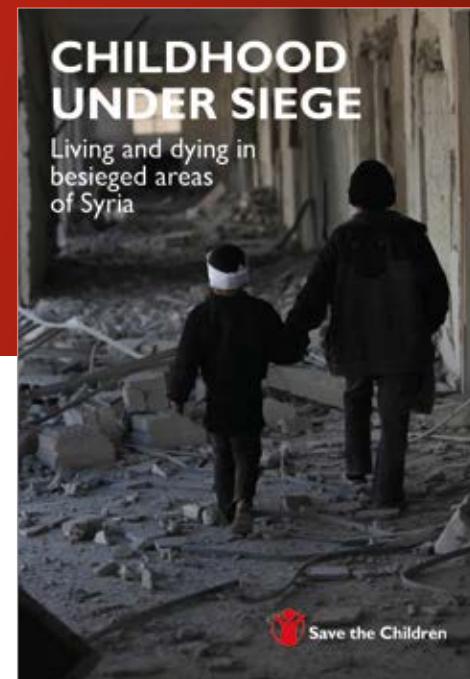

Childhood Under Siege: Living and dying in besieged areas of Syria

This report sheds light on the reality of life and death that is being endured by people – particularly children – in besieged areas of Syria, and shows the urgent need for the international community to take action. Save the Children and partners conducted 22 focus groups with 126 mothers, fathers and children living in besieged areas of Syria, as well as 25 extensive interviews with local aid groups, doctors, teachers and individuals.

After five years of conflict, the suffering of besieged communities, some



referred to as “death camps”, is perhaps the most shocking evidence of the international community’s failure in Syria. From its observations and research, Save the Children presents urgent recommendations for the involved parties and to the international community at large to end the horrors that no child should witness or experience.

What would happen if 65 million forcibly displaced people resettled in one place? That place would become the world's 21st largest country. The world's 65.3 million forcibly displaced people are falling far behind others in terms of education, health and other key sectors. This is a key message of Save the Children US' report *Forced to Flee: Inside the 21st largest country*.

The report examines indicators most relevant to the well-being of children and demonstrates both the enormous challenges faced by refugees and internally displaced people, as well as the notable contributions they could make to their host countries and communities if they were allowed to do so.

Child Poverty: What drives it and what it means to children across the world

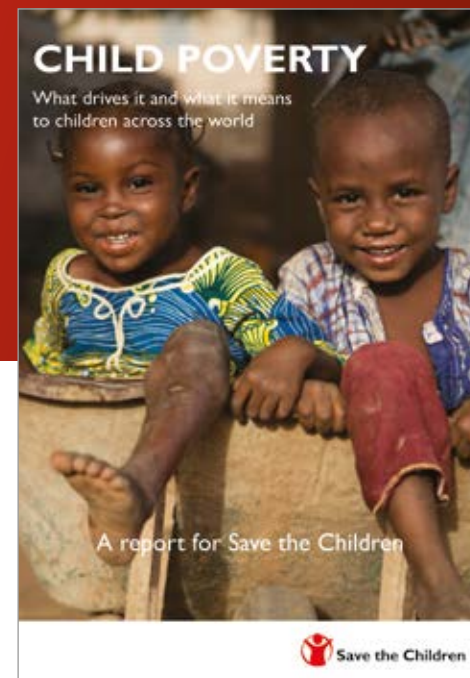

We also hear directly from children in poverty: our best guides to understanding the urgency of this challenge.

This report is part of a concerted effort by Save the Children, together with partners in the Global Coalition to End Child Poverty, to ensure that the poorest children across the world receive the attention that

they deserve. While there are great differences between societies, it is clear that fundamental similarities exist in the drivers and experiences of child poverty. The same is true of the essential solutions.

At What Cost? The human, economic and strategic cost of Australia's asylum seeker policies and the alternatives

This report explores the human, economic and strategic cost of Australia's current policies which seek to deter asylum seekers from migrating to Australia by sea. It examines the impact of these policies in a domestic, regional and global setting, taking into account the unprecedented scale of global forced migration at present and the limited range of options

currently available to those in the region with protection needs. It provides a set of alternatives which would bring an end to the harm that is being done and ensure the protection of a much greater number of refugees in the region.

The year 2015 witnessed extensive progress towards universal prohibition of physical and humiliating punishment of children; more than half of UN member states have now achieved legal prohibition in all settings or have expressed their commitment to do so. However, the majority of children across the globe still experience physical and humiliating punishment at home.



This booklet is based on an internal desk review of Save the Children's and partners' work against physical and humiliating punishment of children, commissioned by Save the Children Sweden. It presents best practices and lessons learned from different parts of the world on how to stop physical and humiliating punishment of children and to promote positive discipline.

Two Years of Drought Response in Ethiopia

El Niño has caused the third successive rainfall failure in some areas of Ethiopia. From mid-2015 onwards, the country has been in a race against time to meet the resulting food needs of 10.2 million people. This precarious situation has called for the collective resources of governments around the world to help the government of Ethiopia to provide enough food and aid to enough people in time.

This is one of the largest humanitarian operations in the world, and has been led and coordinated by the government of Ethiopia, which has itself

committed USD \$381 million during 2015-16. This report details the role and contribution of Save the Children, which is programming USD \$90 million worth of relief activities, has raised USD \$6.5 million of its own funding contributions, reached nearly 2 million people, and helped to save the lives of thousands of children. Every effort must now be renewed and sustained to support the government's efforts to prepare for the impacts of such prolonged drought and assist the affected population to make a quick recovery.

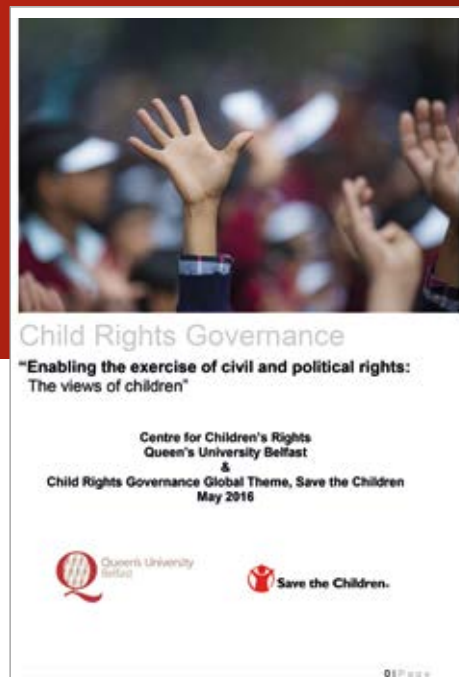

Enabling the Exercise of Civil and Political Rights: The views of children

The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, ratified by nearly every country in the world, gives children the right to participate in governance at different levels of society. Save the Children's Child Rights Governance Global Theme, together with the Centre for Children's Rights at Queen's University Belfast, produced this study on children's experiences of exercising their civil and political rights. This report presents the views of over 1,606 children across 60 countries.



Children want to be involved in civic action and public processes. Over 80% of children who participated understood and were interested in the decisions made by governments and other people in positions of authority about issues happening in their community, country or the world. What is evident from this consultation is that children can and do engage in civic action when they are well-supported. However, they meet a range of challenges and barriers, many of which do not exist for adults to the same extent.

Yemen's children missing an education

Futures on the Line: Yemen's children missing an education

The humanitarian situation in Yemen has deteriorated month after month since the current armed conflict escalated in March 2015. As of October 2016, 21.2 million people (or 82% of the population) are in need of humanitarian assistance, including nearly 10 million children who are experiencing unprecedented levels of suffering.

At least 1,600 schools remain damaged, occupied or closed. 560,000 children remain out of school as a consequence of the conflict, adding to the 1.6 million school age children who already lacked access to education prior to the conflict. Evidence presented in this report highlights

the importance of education for children's development and wellbeing at a time when they are at their most vulnerable. Quality education can contribute to saving lives during humanitarian crises and protect children from the increased risks of violence, abuse and exploitation. However, to do this, schools must be safe and there must be funding committed to education.

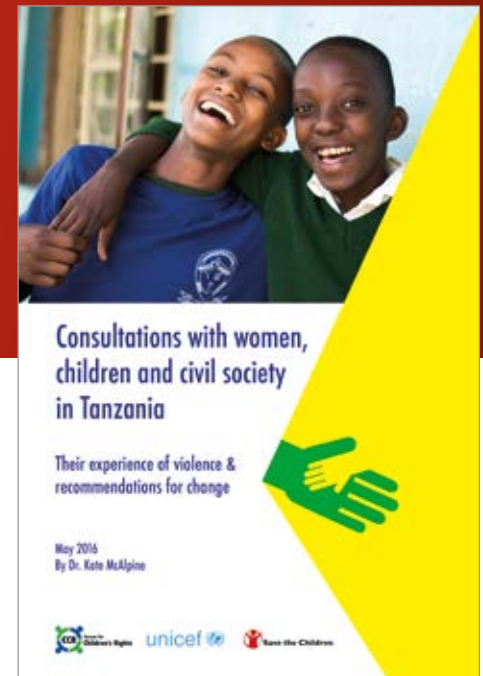

Consultations With Women, Children and Civil Society in Tanzania: Their experience of violence & recommendations for change

UNICEF and Save the Children commissioned this study to learn about Tanzanians' experience of violence against women and children and to solicit their recommendations for a national plan of action to end violence against women and children.

Children and women who participated in these consultations said that they were not safe in their homes or schools. They were not safe around their parents, their teachers or their partners. A Tanzanian culture that disrespects young people and women, and that enables poor parental

behaviour puts children at risk of becoming victims of violence. Whilst many citizens and civil society organisations endeavour to protect children, the study revealed a tendency to respond to the victims of violence, rather than to mobilize attention on preventing violence in the first place. Six key dilemmas of ending violence against women and children were identified. These need to be confronted in the national planning process if violence is to be prevented and responded to in Tanzania.

DID THE HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE TO THE NEPAL EARTHQUAKE ENSURE NO ONE WAS LEFT BEHIND?

A case study on the experience of marginalised groups in humanitarian action

Did the Humanitarian Response to the Nepal Earthquake Ensure No One Was Left Behind?

In April and May 2015, two large-scale earthquakes struck Nepal, killing almost 9,000 people, damaging over half a million houses and displacing hundreds of thousands of people from their homes.

When disaster strikes, vulnerable and marginalised groups have fewer and more fragile livelihood options, less access to social and economic resources, less ability to influence the relief effort, and face more barriers accessing assistance – often without the political voice that would enable them to advocate for those barriers to be addressed.

This report seeks to leverage the lessons learned from the earthquake and make recommendations aimed at ensuring an equitable and inclusive reconstruction process. This report helps to ensure that future preparedness work undertaken in Nepal enables a more inclusive and equitable disaster response, and that the international humanitarian system will enable more effective and targeted humanitarian action for the world's most vulnerable and marginalised people.
